MOTHER MONICA'S Message



For All the Saints Who Keep On Going!

This Sunday we celebrate All Saints Day. In decades past, this feast day was part of a two day celebration: an All Saints Day in which we remembered and honored those past heroes of the Church who had been specifically named and set apart as "Saints" by the Church's leadership and process. Then, on the day after, we celebrated All Soul's Day-- which was the day set apart for praying for all friends, family members and others in our communities who have gone before us.

In the modern church calendar, most congregations have 'conflated' these two days into one-- and we celebrate all who have gone before us at one time on the Feast of All Saints. In many ways, this newer approach seems to be better suited to our recognition that there are many 'heroes' of faith and practice who remain unnamed and unknown except by those whose lives they touched. Celebrating all the saints of the Church-- those who have been granted the lofty title and those who worked tirelessly but were never recognized-- is in keeping with what 'saintliness' is all about. "Saint" means holy, set apart for God's purpose and in our baptism every new Christian is named as both saint and sinner. In Ephesians 1, St Paul confirms it: he expressed love toward all the saints in the present tense and the "hope to which he has called you/us." That hope is not escapist; it is vocation. It looks like naming everyday saints-Barbara organizing potlucks, Sally stocking the food bank, Tom repairing a neighbor's porch-and ringing bells for those who've died while also blessing those who live into the calling of Jesus now. The communion of saints-past, present, and future-frames worship as a shared table where we all gather.

All Saints calls us to speak of death without denial and to live resurrection without delay: to grieve with hope, to love enemies with action, and to bless our communities with tangible mercy. That is how saints—living and dead—teach us to risk, to rejoice, and to keep going.




