Mother Monica's Message

When does Christmas **REALLY** End?

Our secular world around us has already taken down the trees-- in fact, before Christmas Eve the local stores had Valentine's Day candy fighting for shelf space with the candy canes and stocking stuffers. The elevator Christmas music in the stores is turned off at midnight on Christmas Day and the rest of the world returns to 'normal'.. til next Halloween when the stores trot it all out again.

How far we have fallen from what our Christmas Season is supposed to be. In the Christian tradition, we observe a Twelve Day Christmas season from Dec 25 up through Jan 5. On January 6, our focus turns to the Season of Epiphany, when we celebrate the arrival of the three Kings or wise men to visit Jesus. *See, Deacon Bill's message.*

The Christmas Season is famously celebrated in the Twelve Days of Christmas Carol. For an interesting explanation of the history and symbolism of the carol, see the following link below:

Would you like to celebrate Christmas even LONGER? Leave the tree and decorations up through January? Some Christians, especially in parts of England and Europe, continue the Christmas season until the Feast of Candlemas, on February 2. Candlemas, also known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ, is a Christian holiday commemorating the presentation of Jesus at the Temple. It is based upon the account of the presentation of Jesus in Luke 2:22–40. On this feast day Christians often bring candles to church for blessing and use in their homes throughout the year.

Whichever end date you choose--the take home message is this: Christmas is not a single night, nor 24 hour feasting and gift giving extravaganza. It is a holy time of celebration, fellowship and reflection, preparing all of us to embrace the arrival of Christ into our lives and hearts And by so doing, enabling us to go out into the world to share God's love with all God's children.

We are moving from celebrating the Christmas season to Epiphany. The diocese will mark that date with the ordination of 5 people to the diaconate at the cathedral. I have been mentoring one of the candidates for ordination over the last year, which gives an opportunity to reflect on our journeys and the journey to my ordination and ministry afterward.

The word Epiphany can be used in two ways in our language that can be related; first is an appearance or manifestation especially of a divine being and the second an illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure. We celebrate on the arrival of the wise men on January 6th as the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles.

Recognizing and answering God's call to us is also requires an epiphany, where each of us takes the time to respond to God's call to us. Recognizing a call becomes that illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure in our life. Discerning a call to a ministry, whether a lay ministry in the church or the community, an occupation or role in the greater community, or ordination as a minister in the church requires an epiphany, a light coming on in our mind and soul. That epiphany can be a single event or series of gentle nudges from God in a direction. An epiphany can also be something that we discern to change how we take care of each other or take care of ourselves so we can answer our greater call. We tend to view an epiphany is a major event but many times they are a series of small illuminating discoveries that point us in a different, more healthy direction.

During Advent we talked about finding those thin places, where distance between God and Heaven and the Earth is thin and we can hear God's voice. Whether it is a quiet place, a conversation with someone, or on a walk in the community or nature; those thins spaces are where those epiphanies occur, if we listen. So, in this season of Epiphany, let us all look for the light of Christ in our thin places and see what direction God is pointing us on our journey.

Welcoming Watertown Update



Year-end Financial Update

We are pleased and thankful to report that St Paul's closed out the year with very robust giving, thanks in large part due to folks' completing their pledge commitments and the success of our Match donation campaign.

First, our pledge drive ended up with a slight increase over last year in both the number of pledging households and the overall dollar amount of pledges. Total pledges: \$82,480 (up \$4650 from last year) and 26 pledging households (a gain of 3). We also received a total commitment of \$2,000 for the Firm Foundation Building Fund. And ---drum roll please-- our Match campaign has resulted in total donations of \$7220. (including the \$2500 pledge that was the seed money). *Praise the Lord!*

Help Us Help Hungry Neighbors

Would you like to help us help our neighbors who experience food insecurity? Did you know that St Paul's regularly provides support through three area food ministries in Watertown?

*The Bread and Roses meal ministry was originally founded at St Paul's but is now housed at Immanuel Ev Lutheran Church and provides a free meal to anyone in need on Thursday evenings. Member Liz Fritz is on the Bread and Roses Board and may be contacted for more information.

*St Paul's is also an active participant in the weekly Food to Go and Grow (FTGAG) bag program which sends food home weekly to families identified through the public school system as being in need of extra help. We provide items for the bags as requested by the weekly menu (applesauce or fruit, etc.). Martin Ruder is our lay leader and main contact for this program.

*In the summer months (June, July and August) St Paul's provides weekly bag lunches to any who attend our weekly Sandwiches in the Park program on Tuesdays. A balanced bag lunch is available for any who join us. This coming summer we will be looking for 3 Leaders (one for each month) to run the program. Questions?
